





The Aubrey Sake

The Tsuchida Aubrey Junmai is the fruit of a unique collaboration between The Aubrey London, The Aubrey Hong Kong, and Tsuchida Brewery, a small sake producer nestled in the picturesque Gunma prefecture of rural Japan.

The Head Sommelier of The Aubrey London designed the final style of the sake and Tsuchida masterfully executed it. This premium Junmai sake is crafted from locally grown Asahi no Yume rice, to be polished only 90%.

The Tsuchida Aubrey Sake distinguishes itself with a low alcohol content of only 13% (typical Sake is from 15%-18%) , a conscious choice to create a lighter, palate-friendly experience without the overpowering spirit notes.

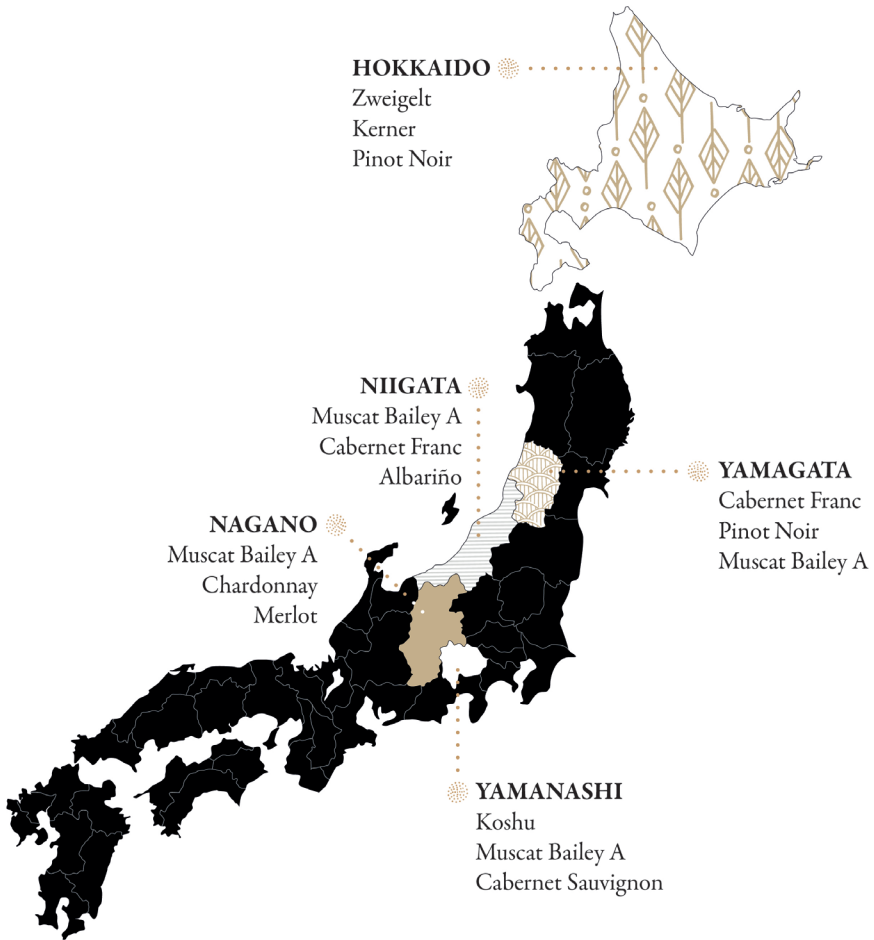

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*** *Sips of Japan* ***



Japan has been growing grapes as early as 718 AD in Katsunuma, Yamanashi Prefecture, yet its wine production is still in a stage of discovery, with consumption and exportation growing over the last century.

Introduced initially by missionaries from Portugal, the Japanese began exploring wine production using sake brewing equipment with Europe's influence. It was after World War II that Japanese wine experienced a boom producing superior wines using only domestically cultivated grapes.

Today, four main prefectures produce varieties of grapes and wine: Hokkaido, Yamagata, Yamanashi and Nagano. Japanese wine are marked for their diversity and unique taste.

*** *Featured Brewery: Tsukino Katsura* ***

Founded in 1675, Tsukinokatsura has long been at the forefront of Nihonshu production. Being responsible for many innovations, including the introduction of porcelain-aged sake and nigorizake, they continue to innovate today by working to champion locally developed rice varieties. Based in Fushimi, Kyoto, their sake is produced with the famous soft Fushimi waters – very pure and low in mineral content, produced elegant, refined sake with a silky, velvety mouthfeel.

Featured Grower

JACQUES SELOSSE

No winemaker in Champagne is more revered by his followers – or maligned by his detractors – as Anselme Selosse. His wines inspire some as no other champagnes do, while others find them incomprehensible. There’s undoubtedly a force of personality that is inseparable from his wine, and that is clearly evident in the wines themselves. Yet the wines also speak with a life of their own, and they number among the finest in the world. Selosse’s father, Jacques purchased vines in Avize in 1947 and began bottling champagne in 1964. Anselme studied in Burgundy before taking over the estate in 1974, and over the last forty years he has become one of Champagne’s most influential winegrowers. Although Selosse is revered by practitioners of organic and biodynamic viticulture, he refuses to adhere to either of those systems. His viticultural philosophies are rooted in a deep respect for nature, as well as holistic belief in maintaining a harmoniously balanced ecosphere, but he rejects any systems that he perceives as being dogmatic. ‘I work with the sun and the moon’, he says, and that is as systematic as he is willing to be. All his wines are vinified in barrel with indigenous yeasts, yet little else in the cellar is inflexible, as he treats each wine according to its particular needs. The results are champagnes of unparalleled complexity and individuality, characterized by an astoundingly multilayered depth and a keenly sophisticated expression of place.
